Tonight's speaker brings a wealth of research experience and knowledge to our stage tonight. Dr. Rotberg has had management responsibilities in research and development, program planning, and international education. She has done policy analysis in the areas of science and engineering education, technology development, and international competitiveness. She has designed research to assist in the formulation of federal policy in financing education, as well as developed methods for evaluating educational programs in public policy setting. Her background also includes the design of policy research in areas of income maintenance and housing. She has done analyses of federal programs for children and youth and basic research in learning and psycholinguistics.

Dr. Rotberg received her Ph.D. in Experimental Psychology from The Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, Maryland; National Science Foundation Fellowship, National Honorary Science Society. M.A. in Psychology from the University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; B.A. from the same university.

Serving currently as a senior social scientist for RAND, Washington, D.C., Dr. Rotberg directs research on federal policy options for improving the education of low-income students. The research is conducted in consultation with the Committee on Education and Labor, House of Representatives, and focuses on Chapter 1 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965.
