BACKGROUND

The 1980 United States - Israel Colloquium is jointly sponsored by the United States Department of Education and the Israeli Ministry of Education and Culture. It is one of a series of activities undertaken cooperatively by the United States and Israel under the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding between the two countries signed in Jerusalem on November 15, 1978. The memorandum provides for the expansion of mutually beneficial exchanges and cooperation in the field of education to encourage greater understanding, to strengthen relationships and to further knowledge.

The Memorandum of Understanding provides for two colloquia on the education of the disadvantaged. The first was held at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem in January, 1979. It is expected that similar colloquia on key educational issues will continue to be held in the future, alternating as to country of site.

This second colloquium will enable American and Israeli scholars. practitioners. and policy administrators to share research findings and practical experience and to identify promising programs in Israel and the United States which might be adopted and introduced with mutual advantage to both countries

The colloquium is being held on the campus of The American University. a liberal arts institution whose programs reflect the national and international nature of its location in Washington, D.C. The University's Pollin Center for the Study of Judaism in America, located in Bender Library, will be the conference center. The Department of Education gratefully acknowledges the cooperation of The American University and its president Dr. Richard Berendzen, in sharing its facilities and expertise to support this colloquium.

The Department of Education recognizes and appreciates the past contributions and the continuing interest and support of the National Council of Jewish Women for the United States - Israel education colloquia.
